



Name a Dallas Shelter Animal through Operation Kindness' New Summer Fundraising Campaign

The animal welfare non-profit will let the public name an incoming animal for a donation of \$50 or more

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE (Carrollton, Texas) – As [kitten season](#) peaks and with the latest Texas flood rescue, North Texas animal welfare organization [Operation Kindness](#) is experiencing an influx of animals. With Operation Kindness recently [transferring 122 pets into their care](#) in a single 24-hour period on July 10 —the largest one-day intake in the organization's history — the non-profit is asking the public for donations to cover medical care, food and necessities. This summer they are also requesting help with name ideas for all the pets coming through their doors.

Community members who donate \$50 or more to Operation Kindness through their [summer fundraising campaign](#) will be able to submit a name suggestion — like Green Bean or Mike Wazowski — for their intake team to use for an incoming dog or cat.

“At Operation Kindness, we welcome each incoming animal with medical attention, nourishing food and a name to let them know that they are part of our family as we find them a loving home,” said Ed Jamison, CEO of Operation Kindness. “We can't do our lifesaving work without the support of the community, and we're excited to see the names we're offered from the public through this special campaign.”
