The nonprofit organization has a seamless adoption process that makes it accessible for families to meet animals, like Princess, at the shelter. Guests are encouraged to fill out an adoption questionnaire online that helps adoption staff find the perfect match for each family. Pets are on a first-come, first-served basis, but available animals are viewable online at <u>www.operationkindness.org/adopt</u>.

After finishing the online portion of the adoption process, families are welcome to come into the shelter without an appointment to meet and greet dogs and cats. Staff will review details about each animal, including behavioral and medical information. In most cases, dogs and cats can be taken home the same day.
