National Veterinary Technician Week recognizes the work vet techs do to give animals a better life. Operation Kindness has built an incredible team of specialists that positively effects dogs and cats' lives to support their journey to adoption. The shelter has eight veterinary technicians on its staff, and in addition, a total of 21 individuals on its entire medical team, including veterinarians, vet techs and assistants, that support and administer medical endeavors, giving pets a second chance at an excellent quality of life. The staff cares for up to 140 animals daily in the Rees-Jones Foundation Medical Wing, an onsite hospital providing x-rays, ultrasounds, laser therapy, and oxygen treatments. The hospital and staff also administer surgeries, heartworm treatments, and care for contagious illnesses like ringworm, parvo, distemper, FeLV, and more.

Over the past year, Operation Kindness has also made a significant investment in its medical team to continue its lifesaving work. With more medical staff, an expanded facility and an onsite state-of-the-art animal hospital, the shelter can intake more animals, provide additional quality care and find families for dogs and cats. Operation Kindness recognizes its team's hard work and understands that their support drives the organization to continued success. By helping address the homeless pet population, more animals without a home have an opportunity to experience a brighter future.

Medical team members at Operation Kindness work to improve the lives of thousands of animals each year. By highlighting the incredible work of its staff, Operation Kindness wants to bring in more individuals to join its team and mission to help homeless dogs and cats. With the rapid growth of the shelter and its ability to increase resources and services, the nonprofit is looking to hire at least one additional veterinary technician, among other positions outside of its medical team, including coordinators and engineers.

Animal wellness and enrichment lead Operation Kindness in everything they do, providing a safe haven for pets during their most vulnerable moments.
