DETAILS:

Benefits of adopting two kittens at once:

- Two kittens can keep each other occupied and be built-in playmates for each other. This can keep them from being destructive out of boredom and allows them to socialize through their day, if there are not already other animals in the home, while adopters are at work or otherwise busy. If there are older animals in the home, the younger cats can entertain each other and relegate appropriate levels of play to the cat more willing to engage. Many cats are social creatures and will benefit from social time with a similarly aged cat! Many negative behaviors in the home are due to boredom or separation anxiety. With a friend to play and learn with, kittens can enrich and mentally stimulate each other.
- Having two cats, while it is more expensive than just having one cat, can still be affordable due to the amount of supplies that the cats can share, including a litter box/litter, food bowls, water bowls, toys, scratching posts/cat treats, etc.
- Kittens can help groom each other, both as a sign of showing affection toward one another, but also as a comfort and self-soothing activity for themselves. This can result in the cats developing and maintaining better grooming habits than single cats.
- Kittens can help teach each other pro-social habits and increase the speed at which new behaviors are learned. This is like kids watching their siblings face new experiences and tasks and learning from their successes and close calls! A more confident and social kitten can show their shy sibling or adopted sibling how to successfully integrate into a home with people.
